Article XI: Offices Established by Bylaw

191 Article XI. Offices Established by Bylaw

192 A. A bylaw that creates a new office or position must specify the term length of that office,
193 as well as where in the Chain of Command that office falls, although an office created by a bylaw cannot
194 be placed higher in the Chain than one constitutionally established. No office established by bylaw may
195 be immune from impeachment, nor may constitute part of the Executive Board.

196 B. If an office is established by a bylaw that has been appropriately enacted as is outlined
197 above, then the President shall nominate an active member to fill that position who, at the time of their
198 nomination, is not already an FAU Debate officer. The President may select their nominee by any
199 method they deem appropriate.

200 C. The candidates name and office of nomination shall be submitted to the Executive
201 Board for review, who may, at their discretion, ask for testimony. The nomination shall then be
202 subjected to a vote, with a simple majority being sufficient to induct the candidate into office.

203 D. In the event that an office established by bylaw becomes vacant, the President shall
204 nominate another individual to fill that office, after which the procedures outlined above for filing
205 offices established by bylaws shall take effect.
